Shipwrecks

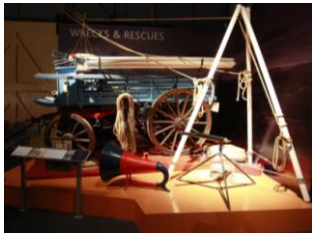
The Port of Newcastle has over the years proved to be a difficult and at times, a dangerous port to work, especially in bad weather.
